

Please know that you are welcome to join St. Teresa in celebration of the Triduum, or Three Days, during which we remember the passion, death, and resurrection of Christ.





We always thought crew socks were needed but in listening to the people we are serving, we have heard the request for "no show" or very low socks. We need both women's and men's sizes. Thanks for any donation you can make. Just bring them to church.

I have a little shoe story for you. A year ago, Mr. Ringler was just getting out of the hospital after almost 2 months, first in the ICU and then in-patient Rehab. We both got through that tough time with the support of you Angels and for me, my boot camp, work-out friends. Money was almost non-existent during/after Gary's hospitalization but bills still needed to be paid. So between my full-time job at VUU, the \$600 housing allowance from Guardian Angels and the generosity of family and friends we were making ends meet. One thing I could not justify was another pair of sneakers for my work-outs even though by the end of April I had a significant hole in the side of my shoe. It seemed like an extravagance so I kept using the shoes. My work-out friends eventually noticed, and I explained, I just had to make them work for now. My friends asked what size I took. Come to find out that two of my friends (Leslie & Katie – same names as my daughters – hmmm) have the same short, wide feet that I have and each of them gave me a pair of their old shoes that I continue to use to this day. I switch back and forth to even out the wear. So even though I have always felt that our Holy Thursday Foot Care Clinic and shoe give-away was a great way to celebrate Jesus' washing of the disciples' feet, and his call for all of us to serve and love one another, in this past year I've experienced having MY feet cared for by my work-out buddies and my survival guaranteed by you, my friends, in your care, nurturing and selfless giving since last Lent. Now, I really know what it's like to need new shoes! Gary and I are grateful for all of your love and care!

We are members of Serendipitydodah for Moms, a private Facebook group of more than 1,500 Christian moms of LGBTQ kids.

Our group was created for Christian moms who want to develop and maintain healthy, loving, authentic relationships with their LGBTQ kids.

More than 450 of us are signing this letter to you because we want you to know that we appreciate you and the Community Christian Church congregation for being a bright light of Christ's love and grace in a dark and unkind world.

We were very upset to hear that an angry man entered your church office and spewed his homophobic rant simply because of the rainbow flag flying in your cross tower. We want you to know that we welcome your rainbow flag, and that it encourages us and brings us great joy and hope and peace.

Many of us have had unpleasant church experiences and left our local faith communities because we no longer found them to be safe places for our family, which is why it is so refreshing and hopeful to hear of churches like yours that understand and practice the true love and radical hospitality of Christ.

We know how difficult it can be to speak out publicly the way you have and wanted you to know we are encouraged by your brave voice and are praying that God will protect, strengthen, guide and bless all of you.

We believe that people like you are helping to change the world into a kinder, safer, more loving place for all LGBTQ people to live and for that we remain forever grateful.

May God keep you and bless you abundantly!



16,655 Paper Crane Project

Chandler Museum is leading a community effort to make 16,655 origami paper cranes. Why, you ask? During World War II 16,655 Japanese Americans were incarcerated at Gila River Internment Camp, located just south of Chandler. We would like to make one crane to represent each individual person who lived at the camp.

The cranes, along with the names of the individuals, will be on view at Chandler Museum as part of the exhibit, **Un-American: Japanese Internment in our Backyard**. The exhibit tells the history of the Gila River Internment Camp and will be on view February 7 through Summer 2017.

The Crane Project & Exhibit remind us that we cannot let history repeat itself.

Making a Crane can be a prayerful meditation

The crane, or *orizuru*, is believed to live for 1,000 years. In Japanese culture the crane has come to represent good fortune and longevity. There are myths of souls being carried to paradise by a crane. And if a person folds 1,000 cranes, there is a belief that their wish will come true. The origami crane has also become a symbol of hope and healing.

Tools for helping others through grief.



Have you ever had the task of helping another, only to discover that you have the wrong tools? It may be painting a room. You have most of the tools you need, the drop cloth, the paint, the rollers. You discover that you forgot the brushes and the tape. A trip to the hardware store is now needed.

Helping others through grief and loss requires having the right tools. And here is the problem - many times in life we don't utilize the right tools. We use only the tools we have learned.

For example, we may say to someone who has just lost a loved one: "Don't be sad, she/he is in a better place." This statement, while it may be true that you believe the person to be in a better place, is an **intellectual statement**. The person grieving is **hurting emotionally** as she/he misses the beloved.

Perhaps the best tools one can provide are:

1. **Presence.** We don't have to say anything. We just have to be there. "I am so sorry for your loss" goes a long way.
2. **Listening.** Allow the person who is grieving to express thoughts, concerns, fears, memories, without judgment, analysis or criticism. (The grief recovery method suggests using an image of being a "heart with ears".)
3. **Share the memories and stories you have.** This will allow you to connect with the bereaved without having to guide, lead and answer the grieving person.

Please remember that a grieving person is not broken, and therefore does not need to be fixed. The person needs to be listened to with respect and dignity.

Grief support is available to you and your loved ones at no cost to you. This may include individual grief support, phone support or Grief Recovery Method groups.



Yom HaShoah / יום השואה

Yom HaZikaron laShoah ve-laG'vurah (יום הזיכרון לשואה ולגבורה; "Holocaust and Heroism Remembrance Day"), known colloquially in Israel and abroad as Yom HaShoah (יום השואה) and in English as Holocaust Remembrance Day, or Holocaust Day, is observed as Israel's day of commemoration for the approximately six million Jews and five million others who perished in the Holocaust as a result of the actions carried out by Nazi Germany and its accessories, and for the Jewish resistance in that period. In Israel, it is a national memorial day and public holiday. It was inaugurated on 1953, anchored by a law signed by the Prime Minister of Israel David Ben-Gurion and the President of Israel Yitzhak Ben-Zvi. It is held on the 27th of Nisan (April/May), unless the 27th would be adjacent to Shabbat, in which case the date is shifted by a day. Yom HaShoah begins at sundown on Sun, 23 April 2017.




Wednesday, April 12 – **7AM Mass** – Maybe you cannot attend every week but try and put this simple mass into your schedule during Holy Week!

April 13 from 7AM – 12PM (6AM set up; 12PM clean up) Guardian Angels Catholic Community and ASU Community Health Nursing Students are sponsoring a *Foot Care Clinic* at our church. Foot problems are one of the biggest challenges faced by our homeless friends. Our friends will be asked if they would like to soak their feet and any sore areas will be examined and treated by both our Nursing students and nurses from our community. We are collecting **donations of socks and shoes** for this effort. Gently used shoes are acceptable but we prefer new and we really want new socks. We will offer a free breakfast to the folks who show up for the clinic, for the students and for anyone from our faith communities who come to volunteer. Bring your donations with you to church. You are also welcome to bring your donations to the office during the week. (Office open Tues, Wed and Friday: 9AM – 12PM) We need everything before Holy Thursday Morning. Volunteers will help with the lunch, with giving out the shoes, socks and cleaning out the foot cleaning bins.

We extend a special welcome to wailing babies and excited toddlers.


